Mobile Plug-in for Copernic Desktop Search available now as a beta download

Mamma.com, a provider of search technology for the Internet and desktop space, announced an add-on for its Copernic Desktop Search product targeted at the mobile **phone** users community. The plug-in allows users to search and access their emails, files, music, pictures, videos and other content stored on the PC, remotely via any mobile device. The Mobile Plug-in for Copernic Desktop Search is easy to install and requires no special configuration from the user. After the plug-in is installed, all that the user needs to do is visit mobile.copernic.com using the mobile device's [Internet](#) browser and log in to access the computer's content, including documents, emails, email attachments, pictures, music, movies and contacts, that are indexed for easy retrieval. The plug-in features a friendly user interface and is able to adapt the content of documents for quick viewing on mobile devices. For example, a PDF document stored on the PC is automatically converted and displayed on the phone without any software installation required. The found items are previewed with text excerpts, picture thumbnails and metadata. The users can also download remote files and instantly dial phone numbers found in address books. From a users perspective, the ability to search and access all their digital media and files stored on their PC, anywhere, anytime, regardless of the size of their mobile device memory and without synching in advance, is a new and exciting concept that presents a wealth of possibilities", said Martin Bouchard, President & CEO of Mamma.com.
