Cristiano Ronaldo Makes Successful Man U Return

The Portuguese scored 2 goals in Manchester United's friendly against Oxford Utd

Although the English media did not announce Cristiano Ronaldo as part of Alex Ferguson's team for the Oxford United friendly, the Portuguese was part of the starting line-up for Manchester. And, just to make things even with the "red devils" supporters, he made a remarkable comeback into the team. Ronaldo scored twice for his team as Manchester United extended their winning streak to 3 games.
