iSkysoft points out that DVD-Library for Mac Beta is "a legal DVD-backup application for Mac OS X," able to create an image (.ISO) of a DVD disc in "DVD Box" to backup one's DVDs. Best of all, if you already have [iSkysoft iMedia Converter for Mac](#), you can import your ISO files and convert them to iPhone, iPod, Apple TV, Zune, PSP, Xbox 360, PS3, Creative Zen, Archos, PMP, Smart Phone, Pocket PC, PDA, Cell Phone, MP4 Player, MP3 player and many other video and audio players.

The main features of DVD-Library include the ability to: legally backup your DVD to Mac and portable hard disc without any loss; build your own DVD library on Mac to manage, sort and share your DVD; playback your collected DVDs on Mac without inserting DVD discs; convert DVD to all sorts of video formats for portable players via active associated iSkysoft iMedia Converter for Mac.

iSkysoft asks those who decide to download and try out the Beta version of DVD-Library to provide feedback so that the company can improve the software in the shortest time possible. Users should note that DVD-Library is a Beta software, therefore they should not completely rely on the application.

DVD-Library requires MAC OS X 10.4 or later, a 1GHz or above Intel processor, 1GB of RAM or more, at least one DVD-ROM drive, an Internet connection for certain features (sharing), and the VLC player installed.
