Bob Geldof, the organizer of Live 8 concerts, recently confessed that he thinks George Bush has helped Africa more than any other American president and defended Bush on the issue in France. "They refuse to accept, because of their political ideology, that he has actually done more than any American president for Africa," he told Time magazine. "But it's empirically so." Geldof is stressed because he hopes this concerts will remain a cultural event and will not become a political matter.
