The way that they say that is a little different but as long as it's on their property, it's OK," one of the residents said for [wbztv.com](#). "It's pretty impressive. It has a pretty deep meaning," another added. At this time, I can show you only a picture with the message because it seems like the family who wrote it demanded the website above to avoid publishing a link to the map as they are afraid to show their address on the Internet. This is not the first time when Google's mapping tool shows some unexpected messages to the users. The search giant even encouraged the consumers to create unique banners to appear on the maps in January when Google prepared a new photo session with Sydney, especially prepared for the Australian Day. However, the entire campaign was stopped because Google didn't receive the approval to fly at 600 meters altitude.
