Every Internet user appreciates a well defined website both from content and layout point of view. The simplest method to build a website is to use a content management system. The ultimate desire of any webmaster resides in finding a universal purpose content management system that is compliant with Web 2.0 rules and could serve for various purposes. ImpressCMS allows the addition of new features and functionalities through various modules that generate a high flexibility in content management. As a consequence, the implementation of an image gallery, forum or a blog is just a matter of installing the corresponding module. The user management system has advanced security features and is easy to customize.

ImpressCMS still provides compatibility with modules and themes created for XOOPS content management system, but is very different in functionality as compared to XOOPS. As its name says, anyone will be able to create an impressive website based on ImpressCMS, in the first place due to the existing options to adapt any part of the CMS core to any user needs.
