[Intel CEO Spills the Beans on Apple's New, 'Larger' iPhone](#)

Allegedly, Apple's upcoming device will use Intel's new Atom chip and will sport a bigger screen

Sadly, a few beans are also rolling on the streets of Switzerland as a result of Swisscom disclosing the fact that Apple's upcoming iPhone model will support streaming television, Macstein is [reporting](#). Word has it it will become available through the exclusive Swiss carrier.
