Beta driver released for MacBook owners

Kensington rolled out an update to its sd200v Notebook Docking Station with Video on Tuesday. The company *creating innovative products that make the connection between you and your computer more enjoyable and productive* also announced this week a new beta software for MacBook owners looking to use its sd200v. Kensington claims that its new driver allows MacBook owners running Mac OS X v10.4.11 or later to use the sd200v Notebook Docking Station with Video. Some of you are probably wondering what the device actually does. I'll tell you. The sd200v allows a laptop user to extend its capabilities with an external VGA display connection, as well as an extra keyboard and mouse connection, or up to five USB device connections, all through a single USB port. The Kensington sd200v Notebook Docking Station with Video is available both at brick-and-mortar electronic stores, and at online stores. It costs \$139.99. Requirements call for an Intel-based Mac (including Mac Mini - Intel, iMac - Intel, MacBook, MacBook Pro, MacBook Air, and Mac Pro) running Mac OSX Tiger 10.4.11 or higher.
