After being launched in May 2006 as the E-series' business family newest addition and until now being available only in a silver suit, the Finnish mobile phone manufacturer **Nokia** has finally decided to give us all the new **E50** handsets all dressed up in a very nice black suit. The new color will most probably be another reason for the business men all over the world to get it and enjoy the smooth ride offered by the Symbian 9.1 OS S60 3rd edition that comes with the package. The quad-band GSM cell phone that goes along with 850, 900, 1800 and 1900 MHz networks is also featuring a 256k colors **TFT** display with a 240x320 pixels resolution and a 1.3 megapixel camera with 4x digital zoom, together with wireless Bluetooth, GPRS, EDGE, IR and USB connectivity that will certainly offer you enough choices when you'll need a way to connect to some other device. The user also has at his disposal Java MIDP 2.0 technology, Push-to-talk, a multimedia player with support for audio and video files, a XHTML/HTML browser and a number of business and office features like the Visto Mobile, BlackBerry Connect, **Activesync** Mail for Exchange and Intellisync Wireless Email.
