## [Oasis New Songs Leaked on YouTube](#)

### *Songs published on YouTube before the official release date*

Although it's not the first time it happens, new songs have just got published on YouTube even if they were scheduled for a later release date. This time, the leaked songs belong to Oasis and, according to various sources, they were supposed to be included into the band's new album.
