Now we have a new goal." So, here you are. Only 970,000 signatures are needed and Uwe Boll will stop. Will this happen? Never. It was a bad idea in the first place: criticizing a person or a movie is one thing; trying to make him stop doing what he does best (I am sure he's not planning to release sh*tty movies just to piss us, gamers, off) is another thing and it's not alright.
