[One More Street View Car Spotted, One More Google Maps Update](#)

This time in Knox, Indiana

The Street View car which is supposed to be used for capturing street level panoramas to be included in Google Maps was spotted a few days ago in Knox, Indiana. Obviously, this makes us think the Mountain View company prepares new updates for Google Maps as similar vehicles were seen in other cities included in the web-based service. According to Search Engine Land, Knox, Indiana has a population of only 3,721 which is pretty curious because the super giant was focused only on large towns. Today's car is a Chevrolet Cobalt, just like the ones spotted in the past and equipped with lots of high-tech cameras used for capturing photos. A few weeks ago, it was rumored that Google plans to expand Street View into Canada, a country where the authorities warned the super giant of several laws which might be infringed.
