The Indian division of [Samsung Mobile](#) has released the U900 Soul phone, one of the high-end devices prepared by Samsung to conquer the global mobile market in 2008. Other features of the U900 include a 2.2 inch display with 16 million colors and a QVGA resolution (240 x 320 pixels), tri-band GSM connectivity as well as HSDPA for data transfer speeds of up to 7.2 Mbps, Bang & Olufsen ICEpower audio technology that offers an exquisite music experience, Bluetooth, FM Radio with RDS, email and Web capabilities, microSD card support and so on. Samsung U900 Soul is available as of now across India, but we don't know exactly where users can buy it from. Anyway, we do know that the fashionable slider has a retail price of 25,000 INR - the equivalent of \$590 or 380 Euros.
