### *Orson Scott Card's Ender's Game to be developed by Chair Entertainment*

All the science fiction fans out there should be really happy right now, since Orson Scott Card's book "Ender's Game" will be turned into a... uhm... [game](#). And since turning bestselling books into hit video games ain't a job for anybody, Chair Entertainment, the creative team responsible for titles such as Advent Rising and [Undertow](#), were given the assignment. The game will focus on the "Battle Room" featured in the beloved novel.
