The volume of media objectivity, impartial argumentation, unbiased reporting and unprejudiced analysis over AOL's monumental f*** up is down the drain, textual dejections. And the AOL per rectum pax returned to all Internet connections. All because America Online admitted to an embarrassing episode of leaking information about 658,000 of its customers. "This was a screw-up, and we're angry and upset about it. All facets of human existence diluted into a 439Mb downloadable file mirrored all about the Internet. AOL apologized for the leak, when it should have apologized for dehumanization and abuse of power and confidence over consumer privacy. And this is just from AOL, but a spokesperson from the Electronic frontier Foundation confirmed that the Big Brother syndrome is generalized: "All search engines collect this kind of user data, and it's valuable to marketers, insurance companies, people involved in divorce and custody battles," said Rebecca Jeschke. You think you know but you have no idea! This is your life, one search at a time! Ever used a search engine? Google, Yahoo, MSN, Altavista, AOL?

Congratulations!!! YOU have been INDEXED!!! Somewhere between query space describing the population of searches; user sessions related to formulaic patterns comprised in the ecosystem of singular sessions; user behavior denoting categories of user based interactions with the search service; operational requirements ranking time-volume efficiency; content space summarizing the scope of search results and user demographics, your search profile is constructed search by search. Through the looking glass you can be resumed in percentages and ratios, divided, summed up, multiplied, you are not even a zero, or binary or Boolean; you are a point statistic in search for the ultimate fragment of porn. Behaviorism, group psychology, social engineering, navigational patterns, you are the alien element in the binary orchestra, you are random and stochastic. A statistic, a parameter in a search equation, query metrics. An appendix to its own creation, an accessory to the source code. You are 0.FLESH... Carnis ab absurdo... Obey your search master...!
