Sony's BRAVIA Internet Video Link Finally Ships

Streaming, browsing and watching internet video directly on your HDTV

The BRAVIA Internet Video Link was announced by Sony quite a long time ago, back at CES 2007, but due to certain logistical problems, it took quite a while to get to retailers around the world. However, it would seem that the long-awaited device is finally here, so we'll go on and talk a little bit about it and the rather interesting features it can provide. Thus, the device allows users to watch internet video from the comfort of one's own couch with the DMX-NV1 BRAVIA Internet Video Link. This very easy-to-attach module permits the streaming of Internet video clips to compatible BRAVIA HDTVs over a broadband internet connection and occupies very little space around the user's entertainment center, since it fits on the back of one's HDTV. Moreover, by using the Xross Media Bar and the TV remote control, users can also intuitively browse select online music videos, movie trailers, user-generated videos, personalized weather, traffic feeds and more with no additional download or access fees. The adapter supports sub-HD class resolutions and comes packed with an Ethernet port, as well as a Dmex accessory terminal (for compatible TVs only), 1 HDMI input and one HDMI output. Nevertheless, even if it's installed on the backside of a TV set, the device requires a separate power source, which makes connectivity a bit more difficult, but this doesn't really affect the device's overall relatively small and sleek form factor, the Bravia Internet Video Link measuring around 21.6 cm x 3.17 cm x 10.47 cm, at a weight of around 1.6 kilograms. The device from Sony retails for around 300 US dollars, which is a rather high price to pay for such an accessory, but it's worth it, taking into consideration the enhanced level of functionality this thing can provide.
