You're probably familiar with the fact that a [Tekken](#) movie poster was spotted a while back, but now things have gone official and a couple of audition scripts have surfaced confirming the original information. It seems that in the upcoming motion picture, Jin will be portrayed as a drug addict and he'll have to fight Marshall Law as the story progresses. Among the characters included in Tekken, the movie you'll find familiar faces like King, [Mishima](#), Kazuya, Steve Fox, Gordo, Anna and Nina and many many more. Since some of the key scenes have been made available we now know that at some point all the important characters will be trying to escape the Mishima complex and one of them will die in the process. Don't worry about spoilers, as I'm not going to reveal any, but I can tell you that the movie will be available in cinemas worldwide starting next year.
