[The Hulk Returns to the Big Screen](#)

French director Louis Leterrier will be in charge of the sequel

Marvel Pictures doesn't seem too disheartened by the bad reception the first movie about the adventures of the green giant superhero got just three years ago. The 2003 'The Hulk', directed by Oscar winner Ang Lee and starring Eric Bana, cost almost \$150 million to make but turned out a real box-office flop, cashing in only \$132 million in the US. Now, producers Avi Arad and Kevin Feige met with the French director and decided to use his skills for the making of a new block-buster film meant to return the green monster back to his comic book origins. Leterrier is famous for his 'Transporter' and 'Transporter 2', both of which debuted at the top of the box-office. He also made Jet Li's 'Unleashed'. 'His movies have humor and character depth set against fantastic action, and these aspects will be explored to the fullest in "Hulk"', Feige said in a recent interview. But the producers were also conquered by the director's interest in the tale of the superhero and he is said to have already storyboarded two action sequences with the help of an artist. The casting for 'The Hulk 2' will begin soon and there is no word yet whether Eric Bana will take the lead for a second time. Zak Penn is already working on the script and it can't come out but excellent, considering that his credentials include 'X2: X-Men United' and 'X-Men: The Last Stand'.
