Nevertheless, the protestants led by nuns gathered outside the cathedral, in a 12 hour prayer vigil held by Catholic nun Sister Mary Michael. Sister Mary said: "I just don't think it is right that they are filming this story here. I know the Bishop and Dean argue that it is fiction - and it might even be brilliant fiction - but it is against the very essence of what we believe." Dan Brown, the author of the best-selling novel "The Da Vinci Code" claims in the book that Jesus married Mary Magdalene and fathered a child. Tom Hanks arrived on the set in a car and briefly waved at a small gathering of fans, who vied with demonstrators for his attention, before disappearing inside.
