[Ubuntu 8.04 LTS released, installing Hardy Heron, Ubuntu Open Week begins and more...](#)

On Monday, Canonical announced that [Ubuntu 8.04 LTS Server Edition](#) would be available on 24th April, released at the same time with the Desktop Edition. The 8.04 Long Term Support (LTS) Server Edition is Canonical's fourth server release and will be supported for five years with maintenance and security updates. [Ubuntu 8.04 LTS](#) was released on Thursday as expected! Being the second Long Term Support (LTS) version, which means users get security updates for five years for the server edition and three years for the desktop edition, Hardy Heron comes with numerous new features and improvements over previous versions. CNR grants access to a lot of wonderful games, multimedia codecs, video and audio players, image editors/viewers and much, much more!
